CMS - Library web site relationship with parent institution site

- 🕷 “sub-branding”
- 🕷 mjesto unutar strukture
- 🕷 file structure match the navigation
- 🕷 control over the web site layout and design
- 🕷 library's web site - different purpose, destination in and of ourselves, with much more complex transactions
- 🕷 library as part of the intranet

CMS...

- 🕷 CMS's are more “document-centric” - focused on web “pages” - where library applications tend to be more “data-centric” - we want to take discrete pieces of data... and link it to other pieces of information so that the same data can be used in different ways on different pages

Federated searching & OPAC

- 🕸 federated/cross-database search tools - solution for unifying access to a variety of information resources
 - 🕸 can search not only library catalogs but also commercial databases, web search engines, and other databases, while often merging and de-duping results
- 🕸 “post-OPAC era” - OPAC - no longer the center of the “information universe”?
 - 🕸 the universe of available content is no longer limited to that stored within the library walls. Moreover, the type of content required by users is often not cataloged by most libraries

Federated searching & OPAC

- ☆ R. Tennant: “Only librarians like to search; everyone else likes to find”
- ☆ OPAC as a pluggable data source - just another star in the universe of data
- ☆ OPAC will continue to be the central repository for federated searching tool
- ☆ quality metadata based on standards



How are you organizing your digital/print collections?

- where is your e-journals information?
 - opac, database, vendor server, or...
- where are the url's for indexes and databases?
- how do you currently insure that when a patron searches for something, they seeing everything available to them from your collection?
- how do you handle updating urls and journal info?
- how many people are involved in this?
- how are you preparing “pathfinders” or “subject guides” - do they link to your OPAC?

What's wrong with virtual reference?

- 🕷 why don't more people use virtual reference?
 - 🕷 So... there are millions of potential users familiar with the basic technology (using the Web/Internet, e-mail and chat), and 80% of them use the Internet to find answers to “specific questions”. And yet we hear reports of some VR services closing or reducing hours due to lack of use.
 - 🕷 VR - potentially powerful service with major usability problems
 - 🕷 located in library web sites most users don't know of
 - 🕷 we don't know how to share what we know - motto: “We Hide It, You Find It”
